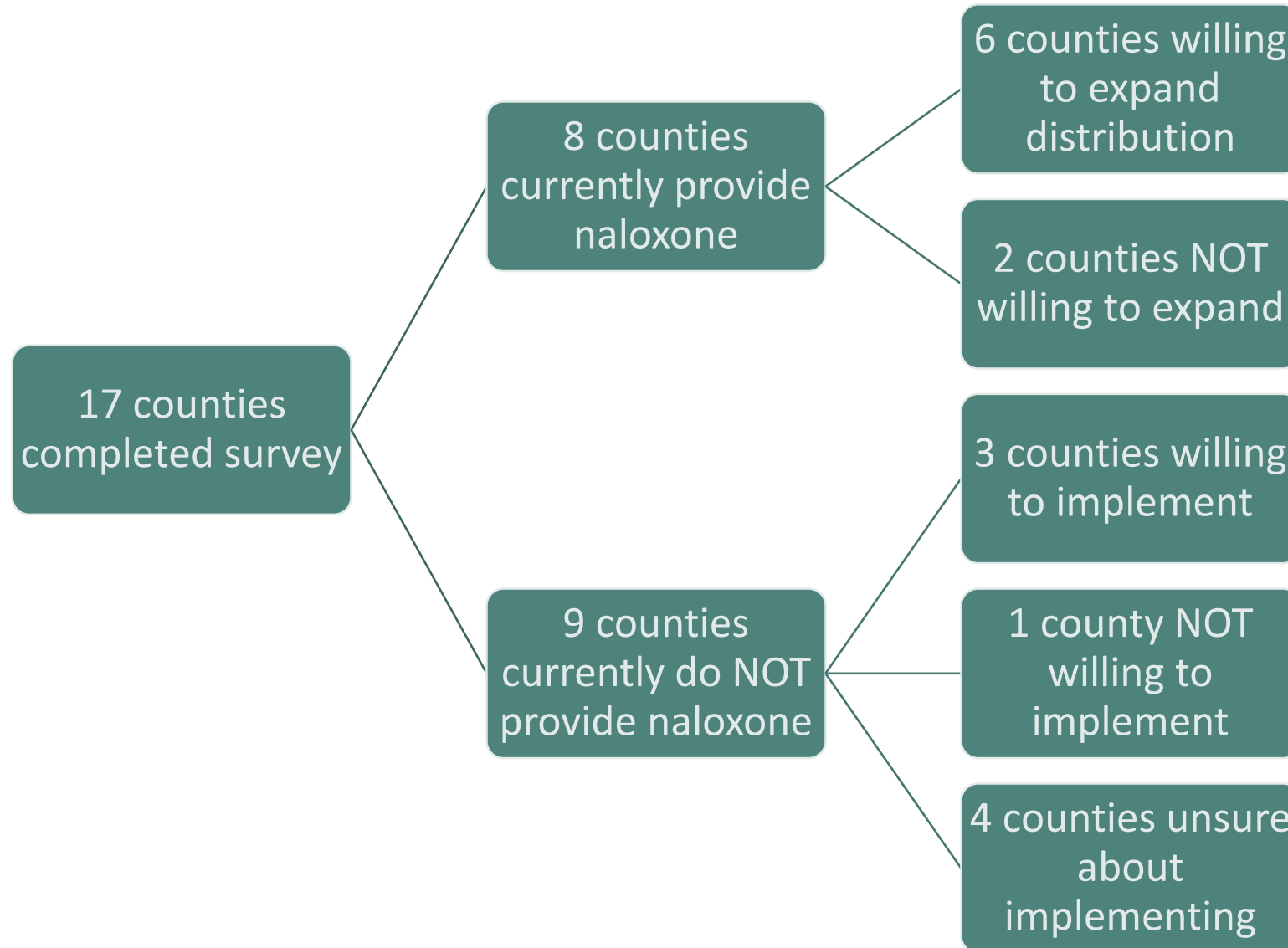

# Survey to Understand the Implementation and Expansion of Naloxone Distribution Programs in MI County Jails

Between December 2020 and January 2021, CBHJ sent a survey to its 24 partner counties to better understand their current naloxone distribution efforts and their willingness to expand or implement new programs. A total of 17 (70.8%) counties responded.

## Highlights

- Eight counties have an existing naloxone distribution program, and six of them are willing to expand their programs to reach more people
- Nine counties are not currently providing naloxone upon jail release, but three of them are willing to implement a naloxone distribution program
- Four counties are unsure whether they are willing to implement a naloxone distribution program
- The most common barriers to implementing/expanding a naloxone distribution program include: limited administrative time to manage a program, limited staff to distribute naloxone, liability concerns, inadequate naloxone supplies, and limited space to store naloxone
- The major resources needed include: staffing, supplies, financial assistance, technical assistance and training, and absolution from liability





# Barriers to Implementation/Expansion of Naloxone Distribution Programs

**Of the 17 counties who responded to the survey:**

**54%** Report limited administrative time to manage a naloxone distribution program

**23%** Report limited space to store naloxone

**46%** Report limited staff to physically distribute naloxone

**15%** Report they do not want naloxone to encourage drug use

**31%** Report liability concerns regarding naloxone distribution

**15%** Report staff restrictions related to COVID-19 (i.e., local health departments are unable to enter the facility to provide naloxone training)

**23%** Report an inadequate supply of naloxone



# Resources Needed to Implement/Expand Naloxone Distribution Programs

## 1. Staffing

- Staff to screen and identify those in need of naloxone, provide naloxone training/education, distribute naloxone, and keep records on distribution and training
- Several sites state the want/need for medical and/or full-time staff to complete these tasks
- Return of outreach/local health department staff once COVID restrictions lift

## 2. Supplies

- Naloxone
- Technology to aid staff in training and tracking

## 3. Financial assistance

## 5. Absolution from liability
